The abstract for The Phyllis Chapter's Workshop is a paragraph that: explains what your proposed presentation will cover. It describes what your paper is about, or what you propose to research/discuss/present.

You may wish to include: Why did you select this topic or subject? Why is your subject important (to you and others)? The significance of your topic to OES history (if you believe it is).

Will you explore and write about a subject that has not been written about before? (That means your work is unique!) Perhaps it has been written about, but did not cover the aspect you are covering. If so, note that fact. Is there an issue or problem you're trying to solve?

What sources did you use or consult to obtain information? Interviews with individuals; official OES documentation (be specific); newspapers; specific databases; trips to cemeteries and other places; other sources
